# **1** Introduction

Zug is Automature's software test automation tool. Zug provides an execution environment for tests specified using CHUR. Zug can be run on any environment that supports the Java Runtime Environment.

### **1.1 Document Purpose**

The installation guide walks you step-by-step through installation of Zug. It gives troubleshooting information for installers. Once you install the tool, you can execute automated tests written in the spread sheet based Chur automation language. To get further information refer <u>ZUG Forum</u> and can be found in the installation directory as ZUG Release Notes.txt

### **1.2 Intended Audience**

This is intended for people who would be running test-cases written in Chur on Zug execution environment. Zug results can be further integrated with Zermatt.

### **3. Installation Instructions**

#### 3.1 Zug installer download

<sup>35</sup> Download the Setup of the latest ZUG package from the Automature FTP site. Please fill up contact information form if needed.

### 3.2. Initialization of Zug installation

<sup>35</sup> Open terminal then go to the folder where you have downloaded the latest ZUG package.

Type these commands

- cd <the downloaded directory>
- sudo sh <ZUG Installer file name>

As for example

- cd /home/dave/Downloads
- ➢ sudo sh ZUG INSTALLER-1.0

You will see the following output as shown below.

### **3.4 Completion of Installation**

- <sup>35</sup> The following screen will appear once the installation is complete. This means that Zug can be run from anywhere in the command prompt window, one does not need to be in the Zug directory.

### **3.5 Version Verification**

 $^{35}_{17}$  Open a new terminal window and type: runzug –version or runzug -v.

This is to verify that the correct version of ZUG has been installed. The version number displayed should match the version number of the package that you downloaded but it will show only if the Licence is activated.

It promts for No License.key as shown in the following screenshot.

### 4. License Activation

Once you have successfully installed Zug in your machine, you will have to activate your License in order to use Zug.

#### Steps to activate your license:

- <sup>35</sup> Download the file **Zug license.key**, which is provided to you in the email address which you had given in your contact information.
- Place the file in the Zug folder where you installed which is \$ZUG\_HOME in your env.

## 5. How to activate Built-in Atom Library

Zug is designed to be user-extensible with plugins, also known as built-in atoms, to deliver additional functionality that target domain specific behavior. Examples of such extensions are atoms that allow testcases to be written to drive web applications by interacting with browsers. Such atoms must be deployed as Java packages (i.e. Jar files), that implement the required interfaces. The recipe for developing custom built-in atom libraries for Zug is described in the **Chur Programmers Guide**.

After deploying the built-in atom library, the library must be activated, so that Zug can recognize the atoms that are part of the deployed package. This is achieved by editing zug.ini, which is an XML file, defining behavioral attributes for Zug. Each built-in package is described using a **<br/>builtinpackage>** section, shown below. Zug allows several such packages to be configured. Example of such a package is Zuoz atoms.

After installation of Zuoz you will see the following screen.

## 7. Troubleshooting the Installation

If you see the following errors do the following:

<sup>35</sup> The prompt appears after installing Zug and trying to check the version of Zug.

Solution: The license key given to you by email needs to be placed in the folder where Zug is installed. Kindly have a look at the License Activation topic.

#### •ZugINI.xml configuration

Zug3.0 version now can call the external java jar files as builtin atoms through chur spreadsheet. To make it happen the ZugINI.xml parsing is need. Inside the Zug installation directory the ZugINI.xml file can be edited to by putting the values in the tags of

if no value is written then it will show a warning message while running the ZUG automation.
